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#### **VOTER INFORMATION**

#### All Voters:

Any person who is a U.S. citizen and 18 years of age or will have reached that age prior to the next election can register to vote. In order to vote in an election, you must either have registered or reregistered before election day or choose to use same-day voter registration during early voting or on election day at polling locations in Bernalillo and Sandoval Counties with a valid form of ID. You must reregister if you:

- 1. Legally changed your name (by marriage or otherwise).
- 2. Changed your residence.
- 3. Changed your party affiliation.

**Party affiliation** may be changed at any time prior to the close of voter registration.

**Primary elections** are held the first Tuesday in June and open to registered members of the major parties. Independent (DTS) voters can utilize same-day registration to vote in primaries. All other elections are open to all registered voters.

Early voting is allowed in New Mexico three weeks prior to a primary or general election.

Online voter registration is now open for New Mexico citizens with a state-issued ID. See **sos.nm.gov** for details.

Absentee voting is allowed for all county and state elections upon application to the office of Bernalillo County Clerk or the Sandoval County Clerk. No reason is needed to request an absentee ballot. The time to apply to vote by absentee ballot varies from election to election. Contact the County Clerk for further information. For municipal, school board and other elections, contact those offices for absentee ballots. Eligible voters can opt in to a permenant absentee list when requesting an absentee ballot through NM.VOTE.org or on their paper voter registration form.

#### THE JUDICIAL SYSTEM

Judicial vacancies are filled through gubernatorial appointment from a list of potential nominees submitted by a nonpartisan judicial nominating committee. A newly appointed judge must run in a contested, partisan election at the next general election after appointment. Thereafter, the judge runs in nonpartisan retention elections, and must win at least 57% of the vote to continue serving.

#### JUSTICES OF THE SUPREME COURT

Five justices are elected by the entire state for 8-year terms. This court is the state "court of last resort."

Be brief in your message. State who you are and give your reasons for urging them to act as you recommend, providing any relevant details on the impact their actions may have on you, your friends or family members. If writing, include your address, and sign your name legibly. If they vote as you wish, let them know you appreciate their decision.

Address the President of the U.S. as "The President," other elected officials as "The Honorable (full name)." The salutation is "Dear Mr. President:" for the President and "Dear (Senator, Governor, Mayor etc.) (last name)," for other officials. The closing for letters to the President is "Very respectfully yours." The closing for all other letters is "Very truly yours," or "Sincerely yours."
