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VOTER INFORMATION

All Voters:

Any person who is a U.S. citizen and 18 years of age or reaching that age prior to the next election can register to vote. To vote in an election, you must have registered or reregistered before voting begins or use same-day voter registration at polling locations in Torrance and Valencia Counties with a valid ID. You must reregister if you:

1. Legally changed your name (by marriage or otherwise).
2. Changed your residence.
3. Changed your party affiliation.

Party affiliation may be changed at any time prior to the close of voter registration.

VOTER INFORMATION continued

As of July 1, 2025, MVD customers who are qualified to vote will automatically be registered and will then receive a notice from the county clerk providing them with what they need to know for voting as well as how to decline to be registered.

Online voter registration is also available for New Mexico citizens with a state-issued ID (see www.sos.nm.gov for details), or you may obtain voter registration applications from the Torrance County Clerk (see page 10), Valencia County Clerk (see page 12) or public libraries.

Convicted felons cannot register or vote while incarcerated, but once they are no longer confined in a correctional facility, they can register and vote even if still on probation or parole.

Primary elections are held the first Tuesday in June and are open to registered members of the major parties. Independent (DTS) voters may also request a ballot for either party to vote in primaries.

Early voting runs three weeks prior to an election. **Absentee voting** is allowed for all county and state elections by application to the office of the Torrance County Clerk or Valencia County Clerk. No reason is needed. The time to apply varies from election to election. Contact the County Clerk for further information. Eligible voters can get on a permanent absentee list using NM.VOTE.org or on their paper voter registration form.

Legislators are now authorized to hire a legislative aide to provide continuous support to their district constituents. These aides are available year-round, but are located within the district, meaning contacting them is not the fastest route to comment on pending bills during a legislative session.

There are 42 members of the New Mexico Senate. Regular sessions begin in January. In odd years, these last for 60 days; in even years for 30 days. Senators are elected for 4-year terms.

THE JUDICIAL SYSTEM

Judicial vacancies are filled through gubernatorial appointment from a list of potential nominees submitted by a nonpartisan judicial nominating committee. A newly appointed judge must run in a contested, partisan election at the next general election after appointment. Thereafter, the judge runs in nonpartisan retention elections, and must win at least 57% of the vote to continue serving.

JUSTICES OF THE SUPREME COURT

Five justices are elected by the entire state for 8-year terms. This court is the state “court of last resort.”

NOTES

CONTACTING YOUR REPRESENTATIVES

Your views as a voter help determine how your elected officials may legislate on a given issue or what kind of policy decisions executive officers may make. Let your representatives and executive officials know what you think. Telephone calls to the offices of legislators have greatest impact, along with written letters. Emails are also useful.

Be brief in your message. State who you are and give your reasons for urging them to act as you recommend, providing any relevant details on the impact their actions may have on you, your friends or family members. If writing, include your address, and sign your name legibly. If they vote as you wish, let them know you appreciate their decision.

Address the President of the U.S. as "The President," other elected officials as "The Honorable (full name)." The salutation is "Dear Mr. President:" for the President and "Dear (Senator, Governor, Mayor etc.) (last name)," for other officials. The closing for letters to the President is "Very respectfully yours." The closing for all other letters is "Very truly yours," or "Sincerely yours."
